2016 Bigelow House Orchard Grant Proposal

We have cleared blackberries, trash trees and weeds from the plot in back of the Bigelow House. The goat and dump fees left little to buy trees. With last year's grant we also bought 6 fruit trees and 3 nut trees. To properly plant the orchard, we have to

- remove as many blackberry roots as possible and move to the dump (\$200)
- plant trees and bushes
- lay down three layers of cardboard (about 3/8 acre)
- cover with at least 4" of mulch
- set up fencing and netting to protect the plants from deer

Materials Costs: \$900
