- 1. Michael Snodgrass, candidate for City Council position 6
 - Michael was invited by Seth to attend our meeting
 - Vision for state capital as "family-friendly, comfortable and safe"
 - Looks at homeless population as 3-4 unique groups, each with unique needs
 - Supports Home First initiative that includes both housing and wrap-around services
 - Supports Public Safety ballot initiative more downtown policing/community policing, mental health advocates to work with police
 - Agrees that Olympia should not shoulder the entire cost related to homelessness Lacey, Tumwater and Thurston Co. should be partnering; we should set a cap for spending on these problems
 - Need to move to action plenty of studies have already been done not happy with status quo and pace of progress related to homelessness, environment and economic development
 - Incentivize change for the business community
 - Describes himself as "a man of action," "works with everybody"
