## Neighborhood Maintenance: What are homeowner responsibilities?

In order for homeowners not to be legally liable for people getting hurt on their property or the sidewalk in front of their house, City Code Enforcement has a few requirements. To see the City brochure, go to <a href="http://olympiawa.gov">http://olympiawa.gov</a>

A quick list. Homeowners are responsible for the safety of others :

- Dangers on the property
- Garbage or recycling accumulation on the property
- Inoperable or unlicensed vehicle (or boat) over 30 days
- More than 3 dogs, cats or chickens
- Vegetation encroaching on sidewalk, signs or street
- Snow on sidewalk or broken sidewalk
- Structure doesn't meet minimum exterior standards
- Building without a City permit
